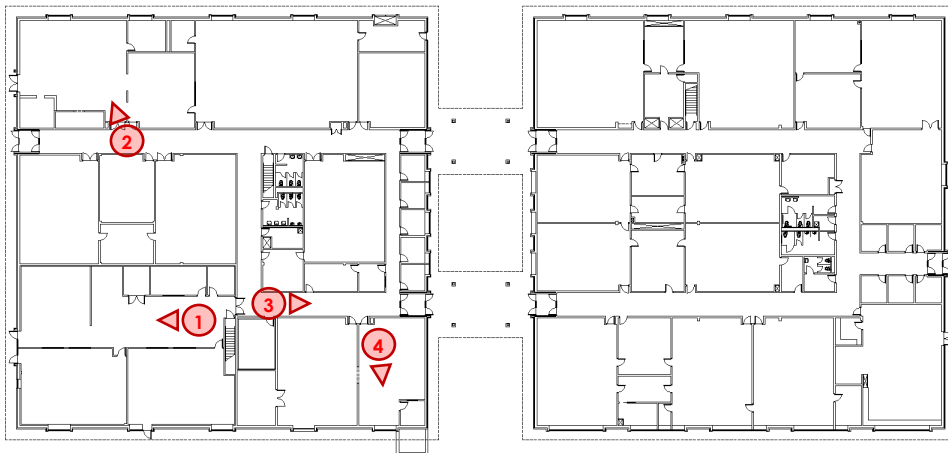


Building Report | E/W Tech Renovations & Addition

5.3.19

The following are pictures from week of 4.29.19 - 5.3.19 in regards to the East/West Technology Buildings Renovations and Addition Project. This project is really starting to gain momentum as there was a good amount of demolition completed this week. As far as the interior demolition goes walls and ceilings are coming down, flooring coming up, doors and windows have been removed. Additionally, a good number of electrical panels that were distributed throughout the buildings have been removed as they will all be relocated to dedicated rooms for both safety and serviceability reasons. Demolition has started on the exterior of the buildings as well with some overhang, fascia, and canopies coming down in between the buildings in preparation for the construction of the new in-fill addition.



Using the existing floor plan of the East and West Technology Buildings to the left I have placed markers associated with the photos shown below for reference. Photo #1 is of the old RCTC computer lab where a lot of demolition has taken place in preparation for when this space becomes the new testing center. Photo #2 shows the progress of converting the old welding lab into the new home office for the Information Systems Department with removal of the doors and welding booths and equipment. Photo #3 shows the removal of the old electrical panels as mentioned above. Photo #4 is of the old Wine Lab which will be remodeled and be part of the Learning Assistance Lab's new tutoring area when they are relocated to their new space.

Photo #5 is still in West Tech looking up the east corridor at the bank of offices that will be removed as this areas will be part of an open computer lab off of the academic commons. Photo #6 shows the results of the demolition of the southern canopy that once connected to the two buildings. Both canopies and soffits in this area will be removed to make way for the addition. Photo #7 is in an existing classroom in East Tech that will be combined with an adjacent room to become a space for adjunct and full-time faculty alike that will include an open-office area, break-room, and small conference room. Photo #8 is a classroom in East Tech that will be split into a new corridor and combined with some existing offices next door to become an art lecture classroom.
