

RULES AND REGULATIONS
FOR AWARDING TRUSTEE MERIT SCHOLARSHIPS

1. Scholarships will be awarded to Monroe County, Michigan residents based upon their ACT/SAT scores (no more than 5 years old), as indicated below:

ACT Score	SAT Score	Award Amount
20-21	940-1010	\$1,000
22-23	1020-1080	\$1,250
24+	1090+	\$1,500

2. New students who are enrolling at MCCC for the first time and recent high school graduates who have dual enrolled at MCCC are automatically considered for Trustee Merit Scholarships with a completed MCCC Application for Admission and official ACT and/or SAT scores by April 15. Students must be registered by June 30 in order to qualify for this scholarship. Scholarship awards will be equally divided between the fall and winter semesters.
3. Scholarship students must enroll in a minimum of 12 credit hours in both the fall and winter semesters and successfully complete a total of 24 credit hours during the academic year including the spring semester. Enrollment in the spring semester is optional if the student fulfills the 24 credit hour minimum completion during the fall and winter semesters.
4. The scholarship is automatically renewable for a consecutive second year provided the recipient has completed a minimum of 24 credit hours with a 2.5 cumulative grade point average at Monroe County Community College by the end of the spring semester of the freshman year. Scholarships for any one individual will not be extended beyond two academic years.
5. Students who are approved for the accommodation of a reduced course load through the Disability Services Office will receive scholarship funding which will be distributed proportionally. Scholarships for students with a reduced course load accommodation are automatically renewable for up to 4 years or completion of 48 total credits provided the recipient has completed a minimum of 12 credit hours with a 2.5 grade point average at Monroe County Community college by the end of each academic year including spring semester. Enrollment in the spring semester is optional if the student fulfills the 12 credit hour minimum completion during the fall and winter semesters.
6. Any exceptions to these rules and regulations must be approved in writing by the Vice President of Student and Information Services or his/her designee.
