Discover the art of jewelry making in this hands-on introductory course designed for adult learners of all backgrounds. Whether you're exploring a new hobby or developing creative skills, this class offers a welcoming environment to learn the fundamentals of metalworking and jewelry design. Students will be introduced to essential techniques such as sawing, filing, soldering, forming and finishing while working primarily with non-ferrous metals like copper and brass.

Through a series of guided projects, you'll gain confidence using traditional jeweler's tools and torches and leave with your own handcrafted pieces—such as rings, pendants or earrings. The course also covers shop safety, basic design principles and the creative possibilities within metalwork. All base metals are provided. If students wish to work in silver, it must be purchased individually.

No prior experience is necessary—just curiosity and a willingness to experiment. Come explore the intersection of craftsmanship and creativity, and walk away with both new skills and wearable art. 
