

Jewelry 2: Wax Carving & Lost Wax Casting

This course builds on foundational jewelry skills while immersing students in wax carving and lost-wax casting techniques. Over eight weeks, students learn to translate sketches into three-dimensional wax models, refine detail and texture, and prepare molds for vacuum casting.

We will cover spruing, investing, burnout schedules and metal casting safety in a condensed, hands-on format. Students also practice finishing, soldering and stone setting to transform castings into wearable pieces. Emphasis is placed on design development, craftsmanship and problem solving, encouraging each participant to develop a personal style while understanding professional production methods. Weekly demonstrations, critiques and discussions of contemporary and historical cast jewelry provide context and inspiration. By the end of the course, students will complete at least two finished works and gain confidence in planning and executing cast metal designs. Please note that you will need to purchase a required tool kit for the class at an estimated cost of \$150. Information will be provided at the time of registration.

This 8-week open studio course provides returning ewelry students the opportunity to further develop their personal projects in a supportive, creative environment. Designed for students who have completed Jewelry I, this studio-based course emphasizes independent exploration while maintaining access to expert guidance and technical assistance. You will have full use of the jewelry and metals studio,

including torches, soldering stations and polishing equipment. An experienced instructor will be present at each session to offer individualized feedback, demonstrate advanced techniques, and assist with troubleshooting design or fabrication challenges. Students may choose to continue projects begun in previous classes or embark on new creative directions, adding to their skills with metal forming, stone setting, enameling or other specialized processes.

The open studio format encourages experimentation and self-directed learning while fostering a collegial atmosphere of shared ideas and problem-solving. Through instructor mentorship and peer collaboration, students will strengthen their technical proficiency, design sensibility and studio safety practices. This course is ideal for motivated students seeking studio time to expand their portfolios, complete unfinished work or pursue new techniques with professional support.
