Archaeology refers to a global social scientific discipline investigating our shared human ancestry. This course introduces archaeology's rationale, history, methods, and theory. Classroom work includes hands-on experiences and application exercises, mini- lectures, demonstrations, and other activities to facilitate the learning experience.
