Course Description

This is an honors section of HUMAN 151, a course that focuses on what the humanities reveal about human values. Throughout the semester students will be encouraged to explore the impact of the humanities on society and the forces which have influenced the humanities throughout history. This is a course to initiate students in the study of drama, art, sculpture, architecture, and music as well as one or more of the other humanities. In particular, students will learn the proper vocabulary to discuss these genres. In addition, students will examine methods of evaluating and critiquing works of art. Attending live performances and museum exhibitions will, whenever possible, be part of the course. This course is a satisfier course for the Global Studies and Honors Degree Designations and will serve as an on-boarding course for honors students. It is reading and writing intensive.

This course is approved as a General Education competency satisfier.
