Prerequisites Successful completion of at least 18 credits in Paralegal Studies, including LAW 151, LAW 175, LAW 205, and LAW 210. Faculty approval and an approved internship placement prior to the semester start.

Course Description LAW 299 provides paralegal students with a supervised professional experience in an approved legal setting. Students apply their academic learning to real-world situations, performing substantive legal work under the supervision of an attorney or paralegal. The internship bridges classroom learning and professional practice, fostering workplace readiness and professional ethics.

This course may be used as a required core course for students pursuing a Paralegal AAS.

Program Outcomes

- A. Explain and apply the standards of conduct, including ethics, expected of the legal professionals.
- B. Articulate the structure of the legal system and the paralegal's duties and responsibilities for the delivery of legal services within that system.
- C. Prepare legal documents using proper legal reasoning and analysis of issues, facts, and law.
