Jewelry Making & Metal Arts

Explore the creativity and craftsmanship of jewelry making through this exciting series of hands-on courses designed for beginning and continuing students alike. All courses are taught by Jiro J. Masuda, a distinguished metalsmith, educator and arts advocate with more than 30 years of experience in jewelry and metalsmithing. Masuda's expertise is widely recognized in the field, and his work has been exhibited in numerous galleries and institutions, including the National Building Museum in Washington, D.C. Students will work with traditional jewelry-making tools and techniques while creating unique, handcrafted pieces. These courses offer an inspiring opportunity to express your creativity and grow as a jewelry artist.

Jewelry 1: Introduction to Jewelry Techniques

Whether you're exploring a new hobby or developing creative skills, this class offers a welcoming environment to learn the fundamentals of metalworking and jewelry design. Students will be introduced to essential techniques such as sawing, filing, soldering, forming and finishing while working primarily with non-ferrous metals like copper and brass.

Through a series of guided projects, you'll gain confidence using traditional jeweler's tools and torches and leave with your own handcrafted pieces — such as rings, pendants or earrings. The course also covers shop safety, basic design principles and the creative possibilities within metalwork.

No prior experience is necessary! Please note that you will need to purchase a required tool kit for the class at an estimated cost of \$150. Information will be provided at the time of registration.

Jewelry 2: Wax Carving & Lost Wax Casting

This course builds on foundational jewelry skills while immersing students in wax carving and lost-wax casting techniques. Over eight weeks, students learn to translate sketches into three-dimensional wax models, refine detail and texture, and prepare molds for vacuum casting.

We will cover spruing, investing, burnout schedules and metal casting safety in a condensed, hands-on format. Students will also practice finishing, soldering and stone setting to transform castings into wearable pieces. Emphasis is placed on design development, craftsmanship and problem solving, encouraging each participant to develop a personal style while understanding professional production methods. By the end of the course, students will complete at least two finished works. Please note that you will need to purchase a required tool kit for the class at an estimated cost of \$150. Information will be provided at the time of registration.

Jewelry Techniques Open Studio

This 8-week open studio course provides returning jewelry students the opportunity to further develop their personal projects in a supportive, creative environment. Designed for students who have completed Jewelry I, this studio-based course emphasizes independent exploration while maintaining access to expert guidance and technical assistance. You will have full use of the jewelry and metals studio, including torches, soldering stations and polishing equipment. Students may choose to continue projects begun in previous classes or embark on new creative directions.

The open studio format encourages experimentation and self-directed learning while fostering a collegial atmosphere of shared ideas and problem-solving. Through instructor mentorship and peer collaboration, students will strengthen their technical proficiency, design sensibility and studio safety practices. Bring your materials, sketchbook and creative curiosity — this is your time to make, explore and grow as a jewelry artist. Prerequisite: Successful completion of Jewelry I or equivalent experience with instructor approval.

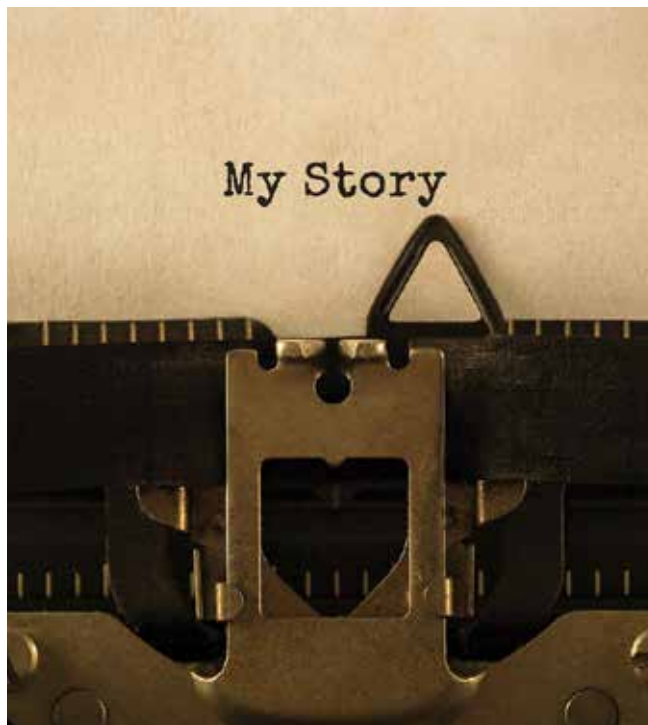

Phlebotomy Technician Certification Program with Clinical Externship

This course is eligible for the Michigan Achievement Skills Scholarship. This 90-hour Phlebotomy Technician Program prepares professionals to collect blood specimens from clients for the purpose of laboratory analysis. Students will become familiar with all aspects related to blood collection and develop comprehensive skills to perform venipunctures completely and safely. Classroom and lab work includes terminology, anatomy and physiology; blood collection procedures; specimen hands-on practice, and training in skills and techniques to perform puncture methods.

NWCA National Certification: This program meets the necessary requirements to take the National Workforce Career Association (NWCA) Phlebotomy Technician (CPT) Exam.

Clinical Externship: This program includes a 40-hour clinical externship opportunity. To be eligible for the clinical, students must successfully complete the 90-hour program, submit to a thorough background check and drug screening and meet other requirements.

Private Pilot Ground School

MCCC is proud to partner with Monroe Aviation to offer an immersive Private Pilot Ground School—the first step toward earning your Private Pilot Certificate. This course prepares students for the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) written knowledge test, one of two tests required to obtain a private pilot license.

Throughout the program, you'll build a strong foundation in aviation principles, including aerodynamics, weather, aircraft systems, navigation, regulations, and emergency procedures. Coursework combines textbooks, lectures and interactive discussions to support deep understanding. Successful completion provides the required instructor endorsement to sit for the FAA written exam.

Although flight training is not included, enrollment includes four hours of access to our Redbird MCX Flight Simulator, along with a one-hour orientation session with a certified flight instructor. The Redbird replicates the cockpit environment of a Cessna 172 and can significantly reduce training time in an actual aircraft in preparation for the FAA practical test.

For those ready to continue into flight training, the instructor will provide information on training opportunities through Monroe Aviation. **Target Audience:** This program is for anyone who desires to become a private pilot.

Successful completion of the course provides the required instructor endorsement to sit for the FAA Instrument Rating Knowledge Exam. Although flight training is not included, the course serves as an excellent complement to instrument flight instruction and provides the foundational knowledge needed to progress toward the FAA Instrument Rating practical test.

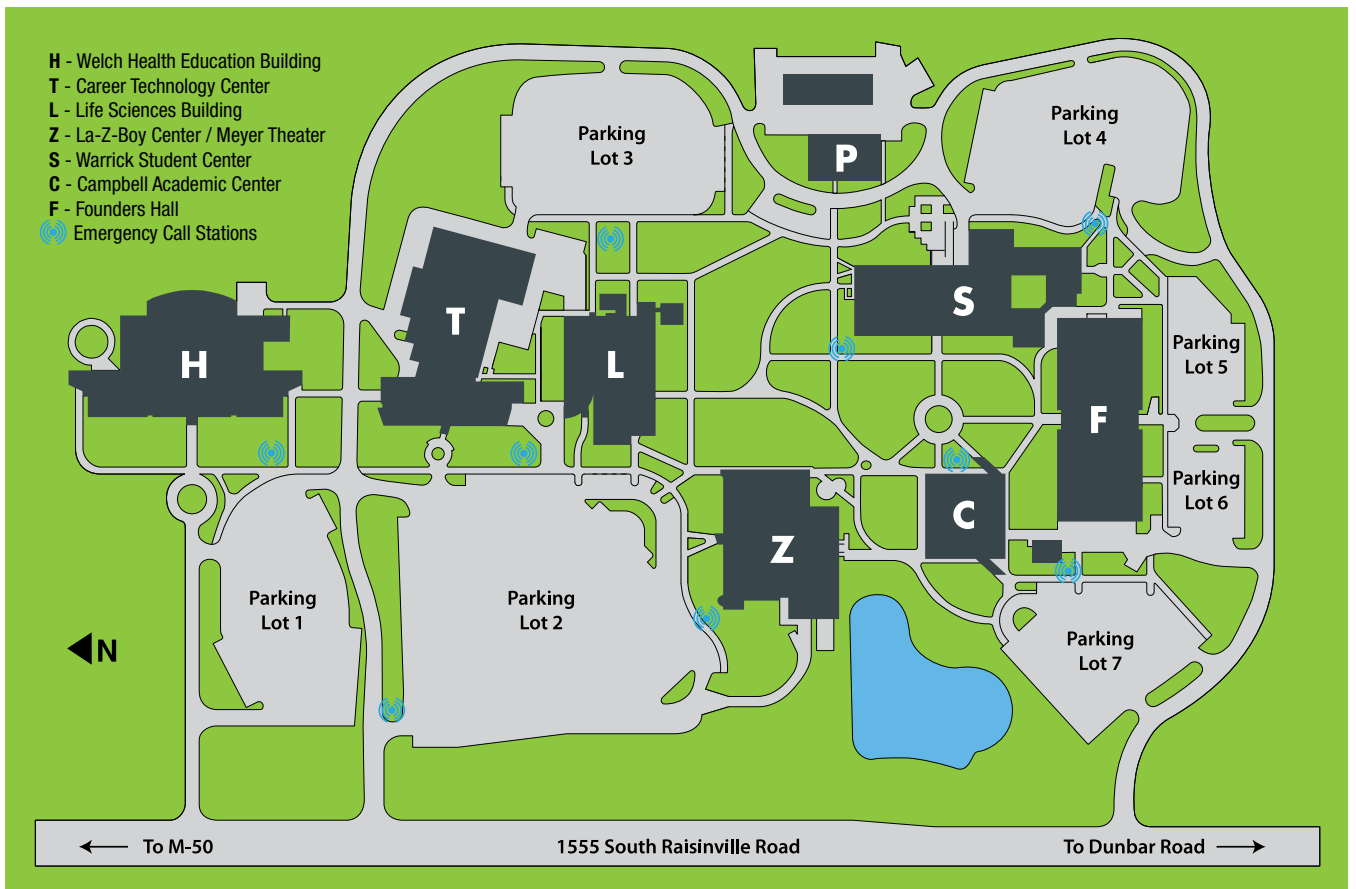
