Since **Blended** courses require work on the computer using Brightspace, as well as classroom work, students should possess the following skills to be successful:

- > Highly self-motivated
- > Have strong computer skills
- > Possess good time management skills
- Know how to study independently
- > Possess good communication skills

Blended classes at MCCC deliver instruction in a web-based format, along with periodic face-to-face classes or virtual classes as established by the instructor.

When taking a **Blended** class students are responsible for:

- A reliable computer with Internet access and Microsoft Word; course specific software will be described below
- Knowing how to email attachments
- Maintaining his or her own computer and Internet connection; technical issues are NOT acceptable excuses for not keeping up with due dates
- General Web Navigation, research and browser maintenance skills

It is essential to log into Brightspace regularly to keep up with communication and assignments.

Brightspace

Blended courses use Brightspace course management system as the means of communication between the students and the instructor, along with periodic face-to-face or virtual class meetings as established by the instructor.

It is the student's responsibility to be able to log into Brightspace and maintain his or her computer setup to work properly with Brightspace.

General Biology is designed to cover selected biological topics that should help the student gain an understanding and appreciation of basic life functions, man's relationship to the environment, and the application of biological data to effective decision making. The class includes units of modern cell biology, chemistry, metabolism, genetics, evolution and ecology. This is the first semester of a two-semester sequence.

REGISTRATION PROCESS

If you are a first-time blended student at MCCC you must complete an online orientation course (ONL-001). You will be automatically enrolled into the online orientation course, which will provide you with critical information on the technical, study, reading and writing skills necessary to be a successful blended student. This course will be listed in your MyCourses module in Brightspace and there will be 4 modules to complete. Please note that all four modules will NOT be visible when you first login, but will become visible once you complete the requirements for each module. Please complete WI2023-ONL-001-L1 by January 3, 2023. Failure to complete the online orientation by the above date may result in de-registration from your Winter 2023 blended course.

EXAMS OR ASSIGNMENTS

The exams for this course require the use of the Respondus LockDown browser and Webcam. Therefore, the computers used to complete exams for this course must be equipped with either an internal or external webcam in order to take course exams. See "Other Information" below for more details.

Course exams are closed notes. Therefore, notes, aids, or additional electronic devices cannot be used during course exams. Additional lecture exam policies and discipline will be provided in the course syllabus and exam instructions.

The computers used to complete exams for this course must be equipped with either an internal or external webcam. If a student's computer does not have an attached webcam, the student needs to identify an alternate computer to take exams or schedule an appointment to take exams at a test proctoring center (e.g., the Testing Center at MCCC). Online course assignments will be completed using Brightspace, the Mastering Biology (Pearson) and Connect (McGraw-Hill) programs.

Software Requirements

Download/access web-based Microsoft Office applications:

- 1. Go to www.monroeccc.edu and click CURRENT STUDENTS
- 2. Next click on EMAIL from the list of links on the left, it will open another window
- 3. Click EMAIL LOGIN, then log in with your entire MCCC email address (e.g., tperson23456@my.monroeccc.edu) and your email password, which initially is your seven-digit student ID#.
- 4. Click on the **9-dot square** in the upper left corner next to the word "Outlook", some Office Suite icons appear
- 5. Click on the **Office 365 with an arrow** link, more Office Suite icons appear
- 6. Finally, click on the **Install Office link** and follow the instructions *NOTE there are links in the instructions if you have difficulties installing the software. Please use those links to resolve any possible installation issues.

FYI - You will not be able to download Microsoft Office until the first day of the semester.

COMPUTER REQUIREMENTS

PC or Mac computer systems with Windows 10 (or Mac equivalent OS) is required.

Chromebook Use Limitations: Chromebooks cannot be used for courses requiring Microsoft Office applications (e.g., CIS 130, CIS 109, etc.). Additionally, Chromebooks do not work when taking quizzes requiring *Respondus Lockdown browser* in *Brightspace*.

Mac Computer Use Limitations: The Microsoft Access application does not work on a Mac.

COURSE SPECIFIC SOFTWARF

The Connect (McGraw-Hill) and Mastering Biology (Pearson) programs will be accessed by students via links on Brightspace. Students must purchase access codes to register for both programs through Brightspace using the instructions provided by the instructor when the semester begins. The registration must be completed through Brightspace and not through the Mastering Biology or Connect websites.

WHERE DO STUDENTS START

Students will receive an orientation memo from the instructor with instructions on how to get started in the class a few days before the semester begins via MCCC student email.

OTHER INFORMATION

A lab manual is required for the lab sessions on campus. This is a custom lab manual that is available through eCampus (see Course Materials and Textbook Information section above).

The computers used to complete exams for this course must be equipped with either an internal or external webcam. If a student's computer does not have an attached webcam, the student needs to identify an alternate computer to take exams or schedule an appointment to take exams at a test proctoring center (e.g., the Testing Center at MCCC). Test proctoring centers are authorized testing locations where a staff person administers a test or assignment. Students near the MCCC campus can take the test in the Testing Center. Additional information on the Testing Center can be found at https://www.monroeccc.edu/testing. If students are not able to arrange transportation to MCCC's main campus for testing, a proctored test site must be arranged. It is the student's responsibility to make arrangements for proctoring with his or her instructor. Students should also be aware that some testing sites have service fees, which are the responsibility of the student.

To login to **Brightspace, E-mail, or WebPal**, go to <u>www.monroeccc.edu</u> and click on CURRENT STUDENTS on the menu bar, then click on Brightspace, email, or WebPal from the links that appear on the left side of the screen.

Brightspace - Login to Brightspace using your unique MCCC WebPal username (i.e., the first part of your MCCC email address) and 7-digit student ID number for your password (or whatever password you use for your MCCC college email account). You should be able to access Brightspace 24 hours after registering for a course. Courses are not available in Brightspace until the first day of the semester.

STUDENT LOGIN INFORMATION

E-mail - Your email address is your MyWebPal user name followed by @my.monroeccc.edu (i.e. <u>jsmith12345@my.monroeccc.edu</u>). Your password is your seven-digit student ID number (including leading zeros).

WebPal - You need a WebPAL user ID and a password to access WebPAL. Your WebPAL user ID is usually your first initial and last name (i.e. Mary Smith = msmith). To find your user ID, click on "What's My User ID?" on the WebPAL home page. Your initial password is your six-digit birthdate (i.e. January 1, 1970 = 010170). After logging on the first time, WebPAL will ask you to change your password. If you are a returning student and can't remember your password, click on "What's My Password?" on the WebPAL home page, then choose "Reset my password." If you have an e-mail address on file, WebPAL will send you a new password.

TUTORING INFORMATION

Trained student tutors and faculty specialists work with students both individually and in small study groups. Student tutors are students who are proficient in the courses they tutor and are recommended by their instructors. Faculty specialists have credentials that are similar to those of our faculty, and many have experience teaching at MCCC or other colleges or universities. In general, faculty specialists have years of experience helping students succeed.

Students who utilize tutoring services at MCCC can expect to gain a better understanding of questions and/or concerns they have about their coursework, suggestions for improvement, study strategies, insight into instructor expectations and the understanding of how to link new material with what they already know.
