Since **Blended** courses require work on the computer using Brightspace, as well as classroom work, students should possess the following skills to be successful:

Blended classes at MCCC deliver instruction in a web-based format, along with periodic face-to-face classes or virtual classes as established by the instructor.

When taking a **Blended** class students are responsible for:

- A reliable computer with Internet access and Microsoft Word; course specific software will be described below
- Knowing how to email attachments
- Maintaining his or her own computer and Internet connection; technical issues are NOT acceptable excuses for not keeping up with due dates
- General Web Navigation, research and browser maintenance skills

It is essential to log into Brightspace regularly to keep up with communication and assignments.

Brightspace

Blended courses use Brightspace course management system as the means of communication between the students and the instructor, along with periodic face-to-face or virtual class meetings as established by the instructor.

<p>COURSE DESCRIPTION</p>	<p>This course provides an overview of major subject areas in psychological science. We will explore several areas of psychology in two key ways: by understanding how scientific knowledge and principles are generated and evaluated and by exploring the implications of psychology's findings. Principles of scientific investigation, including scientific theories, hypotheses, methods, and evaluating results will be applied to the study of human behavior and experience, spanning content areas ranging from cellular to ecological, including biological psychology, sensation, perception, human development, cognition, learning, motivation, emotion, stress, and social processes. We will also apply this knowledge and these skills to psychology and other subjects. The course is designed to prepare students for future psychology classes and to enhance critical thinking skills for other academic studies, for careers, and for everyday life.</p> <p>The Course Outcome Summary can be found at https://www.monroecc.edu/course-outcomes.</p>

<p>REGISTRATION PROCESS</p>	<p>Students must register for the course through the College's regular registration process.</p> <p>If you are a first-time blended student at MCCC you must complete an online orientation course (ONL-001). You will be automatically enrolled into the online orientation course, which will provide you with critical information on the technical, study, reading and writing skills necessary to be a successful blended student. This course will be listed in your MyCourses module in Brightspace and there will be 4 modules to complete. Please note that all four modules will NOT be visible when you first login, but will become visible once you complete the requirements for each module. Please complete WI2024-ONL-001-L1 by January 12, 2024. Failure to complete the online orientation by the above date may result in <u>de-registration from your Winter 2024 blended course</u>.</p>
<p>EXAMS OR ASSIGNMENTS</p>	<p>There are no in-person or proctoring requirements and there are no room scans required for this class. All exams and assignments are completed online within the time frames and due dates set forth by the instructor.</p>
<p>ADDITIONAL INFORMATION: EXAMS OR ASSIGNMENTS</p>	<p>Some online classes require students to take exams at authorized, proctored locations. Test proctoring centers are authorized testing locations where a staff person administers a test or assignment. If students are not able to arrange transportation to MCCC's main campus for testing, a proctored test site must be arranged. Students near the MCCC campus can take the test in the Testing Center. COURSE EXPECTATIONS

The online portion of this blended course has weekly deadlines and online assignments due throughout the semester. Students must submit all assignments through the Brightspace portal as Word, PPT, or PDF documents. In addition, students will be expected to participate in online discussions on various topics throughout the semester. There will also be on-line quizzes, timed exams, and several research projects. The exams are only available online and on specific days other than in-person lecture times. Please check the course schedule for exam days.

The in-person lecture portion of this blended course meets two times per week. Students should come to class prepared to discuss and ask questions related to the readings and topics covered in the lecture.

Students should anticipate reading, studying, and completing assignments requiring a minimum of 7-10 hours per week.

Research suggests that students should spend approximately 3 hours outside of regular in-class or online instruction, per credit hour, per week (e.g., 3 credit hour course + 9 hours studying per week outside of class time = 12 total hours per week), studying in order to be successful in their college courses.

Download/access web-based Microsoft Office applications:

1. Go to www.monroecc.edu and click CURRENT STUDENTS
2. Next click on EMAIL from the list of links on the left, it will open another window
3. Click EMAIL LOGIN, then log in with your entire MCCC email address (e.g., tperson23456@my.monroecc.edu) and your email password, which initially is your seven-digit student ID#.
4. Click on the **9-dot square** in the upper left corner next to the word "Outlook", some Office Suite icons appear
5. Click on the **Office 365 with an arrow** link, more Office Suite icons appear
6. Finally, click on the **Install Office link** and follow the instructions **NOTE there are links in the instructions if you have difficulties installing the software. Please use those links to resolve any possible installation issues.*

<p>WHERE DO STUDENTS START</p>	<p>The course will open by Monday, January 22nd, 2023. On that day, log into the class in Brightspace and read the posted announcement. Please go to "Content" and "Start Here." You will find the course syllabus, assignments, and further instructions.</p>
<p>OTHER INFORMATION</p>	<p>Students need to have a willingness to learn Brightspace technology independently and to engage in effective problem-solving. Students are assumed to be able to work independently and to be competent in using computer hardware / software. Course participation is required, and deadlines are strictly enforced.</p>
<p>STUDENT LOGIN INFORMATION</p>	<p>To login to Brightspace, E-mail, or WebPal, go to www.monroecc.edu and click on CURRENT STUDENTS on the menu bar, then click on Brightspace, email, or WebPal from the links that appear on the left side of the screen.</p> <p>Brightspace - Login to Brightspace using your unique MCCC WebPal username (i.e., the first part of your MCCC email address) and 7-digit student ID number for your password (or whatever password you use for your MCCC college email account). You should be able to access Brightspace 24 hours after registering for a course. Courses are not available in Brightspace until the first day of the semester.</p> <p>E-mail - Your email address is your MyWebPal user name followed by @my.monroecc.edu (i.e. jsmith12345@my.monroecc.edu). Your password is your seven-digit student ID number (including leading zeros).</p> <p>WebPal - You need a WebPAL user ID and a password to access WebPAL. Your WebPAL user ID is usually your first initial and last name (i.e. Mary Smith = msmith). To find your user ID, click on "What's My User ID?" on the WebPAL home page. Your initial password is your six-digit birthdate (i.e. January 1, 1970 = 010170). After logging on the first time, WebPAL will ask you to change your password. If you are a returning student and can't remember your password, click on "What's My Password?" on the WebPAL home page, then choose "Reset my password." If you have an e-mail address on file, WebPAL will send you a new password.</p>
