RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR AWARDING PERFORMING MUSIC SCHOLARSHIPS

- 1. Scholarships shall provide for full payment of tuition, registration fee, laboratory fees and technology fees. Excluded are extraordinary fees.
- 2. The amount of the scholarship will be determined by the number of credit hours carried under existing College regulations.
- 3. Scholarship students must enroll in a minimum of 12 credit hours in both the fall and winter semesters and successfully complete a total of 24 credit hours during the academic year including the spring semester. Enrollment in the spring semester is optional if the student fulfills the 24 credit hour minimum completion during the fall and winter semesters.
- 4. Students who are approved for the accommodation of a reduced course load through the Disability Services Office must enroll in a minimum of six credit hours in both the fall and winter semesters to receive the scholarship. Scholarships for students with a reduced course load accommodation are automatically renewable for up to 4 years provided the recipient has completed a minimum of 12 credits hours with a 2.2 grade point average at Monroe County Community College by the end of each academic year including spring semester. Enrollment in the spring semester is optional if the student fulfills the 12 credit hour minimum completion during the fall and winter semesters.
- 5. Scholarship students must attain a cumulative MCCC grade point average of 2.2 or better by the end of the spring semester of the freshman year for renewal.
- 6. Scholarships for any one individual will not be extended beyond two academic years.
- 7. The recipient will be chosen based on an audition before the Director of the Monroe County Community College Band or the Director of the Agora Chorale.
- 8. Scholarship recipient must enroll as a full-time student participating in the MCCC Band or the Agora Chorale.
- 9. Performing music scholarship winners must be Monroe County residents.
- 10. Any exceptions to these rules and regulations must be approved in writing by the Vice President of Instruction.
