RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR AWARDING PERFORMING MUSIC SCHOLARSHIPS

- 1. Fifteen (15) \$2,000 refundable scholarships will be awarded each year and may cover up to the cost of attendance, including books, fees, supplies and living expenses. The scholarship will be divided between the fall and winter semesters. Any remaining scholarship balance after all academic expenses are paid shall be disbursed to the student each semester in the form of a refund.
- 2. Scholarship students must complete the FAFSA and enroll in a minimum of 12 credit hours in both the fall and winter semesters and successfully complete a total of 24 credit hours during the academic year.
- 3. Students who are approved for the accommodation of a reduced course load through the Disability Services Office will receive scholarship funding which will be distributed proportionally. Scholarships for students with a reduced course load accommodation are automatically renewable for up to 4 years or completion of 48 total credits provided the recipient has completed a minimum of 12 credit hours with a 3.0 grade point average at Monroe County Community college by the end of each academic year including summer semester. Enrollment in the summer semester is optional if the student fulfills the 12 credit hour
- 4. Scholarship students must attain a cumulative MCCC grade point average of 3.0 or better by the end of the summer semester of the freshman year for renewal.
- 5. Scholarships for any one individual will not be extended beyond two academic years.
- 6. The recipient will be chosen based on an audition before the Director of the Monroe County Community College Band, Director of the Orchestra or the Director of the Agora Chorale.
- 7. Scholarship recipient must enroll as a full-time student participating in the MCCC Band, Orchestra or the Agora Chorale.
- 8. Performing music scholarship winners must be Monroe County residents.
- 9. Any exceptions to these rules and regulations must be approved in writing by the Vice President of Instruction.
