'My Kinky Hair is Beautiful'

For Trejha Whitfield, research has become an avenue of personal growth and an opportunity to help empower Black women. A Black feminist scholar, she thrives in educating others on the nuanced ways Black women develop and adapt their cultural identities through their hairstyles. "My experiences — and those of every other Black woman — are significant to many communities in academia and beyond," she says. "My work also offers insights for a much larger audience seeking to understand the self-expressions and identities of themselves and others."



Talking about entrepreneurship

The intersections of urban sustainability and entrepreneurship are at the center of Allison Lucas' research, which examines the impact of how entrepreneurship is talked about and why it matters. "How we talk about entrepreneurship really does have the capacity to influence what type of investments are made and what type of resources are flowing through an ecosystem. It also has the ability to capture the attention of a really broad audience," she says. "It's a lot about where funding goes, but also more broadly, I think it's important there's awareness that different narratives exist, and even though you may be hearing one particular narrative, you may not be hearing the whole picture."

BECOME A WARRIOR

Wayne State sees each applicant as an individual. We'll review your application based on a variety of academic factors and any supporting documentation we may need in order to get to know you better.



1. START ONLINE

Apply at **wayne.edu/apply**, using the Wayne State application or the Common Application. The application fee is \$25.



2. SUBMIT YOUR TRANSCRIPT

Ask your high school or college to submit your transcript to WSU - this step must be completed by a school.



3. FILL IN YOUR DETAILS

If you have taken the SAT or ACT, you may submit your scores to WSU, or you may apply using our test-optional pathway by submitting the required supporting documents — visit **go.wayne. edu/admissions-updates** for more information.

If you have taken AP or IB courses or have already completed college classes while in high school, visit **wayne.edu/ transfercredit** to learn how to apply these credits to your Wayne State record.

After you've submitted your application, start checking your application status portal at **slate.wayne.edu/status** to see your admission decision. Good news starts with: Welcome, Warrior!

There's no better investment than the one you make in yourself. Research shows that college graduates earn about 75% more over a lifetime than those whose schooling ended with a high school diploma.

We have the lowest tuition among Michigan's research universities, but we know many students need additional financial support. Our commitment to you is to help make college affordable, putting a degree within your reach.

Wayne State provides nearly \$329 million annually in federal, state, institutional and private aid through scholarships, grants, loans and work-study programs — 46% of first-year undergraduate students had zero out-of-pocket expenses for their tuition, thanks to our tuition pledge programs.

The first step to financial assistance is visiting **studentaid.gov/ fafsa** to complete the 2023-24 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), which is available beginning Oct. 1. File using the WSU federal code, 002329, as early as possible (and before our priority deadline of Dec. 1, 2022) for maximum aid consideration. Once you complete the FAFSA and are admitted to Wayne State, you will receive your award information, which may include scholarships, grants and federal loans.

How much a Wayne State degree costs depends on a variety of factors, like how many credits you take and whether you live on campus. The charts below offer an idea of typical expenses, based on a first-year student taking 15 credits during both fall and winter semesters.
